Pastor's Perspective

Spiritual growth is not optional. There's simply far too much scripture and biblical examples supporting the growth of believers into maturity. The writers of Hebrews touch on this powerfully at the end of chapter 5.

Hebrews 5:11-14 NLT 11 There is much more we would like to say about this, but it is difficult to explain especially since you are spiritually dull and don't seem to listen. 12 You have been believers so long now that you ought to be teaching others. Instead, you need someone to teach you again the basic things about God's word. You are like babies who need milk and cannot eat solid food.

13 For someone who lives on milk is still an infant and doesn't know how to do what is right. 14 Solid food is for those who are mature who through training have the skill to recognize the difference between right and wrong.

A full sponge can no longer serve its purpose, especially concerning the way we use sponges on a daily basis. If the goal was to hold water, then better to use a cup or bucket. The sponge soaks up the liquid and then is rung out in order to soak up again. It's a receiving and giving reality. Far too many people have been receiving, then coming to receive some more, then attending a group in order to receive some more AND MORE, AND MORE! Is there anything wrong with receiving much because you're hungry to grow? Absolutely not! However, I'd like to submit to you that growth happens best by receiving and giving. In other words, simply coming to church and hearing another message, going to another Bible study, attending another small group, reading another devotional is not necessarily the best way to go. Taking these wonderful things, we're learning and actually putting them into practice actually produces growth and maturity far more. So, I can sit at home on my couch all day watching videos and reading books about the human body and how to make it stronger. I can learn everything there is to know about muscles, diet, exercise, good habits and so on. But if I never get off the couch and put into practice what I'm learning, I'll never actually get any stronger or healthier. A day's

fast approaching Faith Chapel where the need for each family member to begin doing the things we've learned about in the scriptures, modelled particularly in the life of Jesus, will be a necessity. It's time to get off the couch and begin taking action. It'll take all of us. But if we all rise to the occasion and have a heart like Isaiah the prophet who said, "Here I am. Send me!" Then we will launch into the most exciting and powerful season of our lives. It's just on the other side of these bold moves we must make in order to see fruit beyond what we've ever seen before! Let's do this!

Baptism



1 Peter 3:21 – "and this water symbolizes baptism that now saves you also—not the removal of dirt from the body but the pledge of a clear conscience toward God. It saves you by the resurrection of Jesus Christ,"

In Romans 6:3-4, the Apostle Paul puts the matter this way: Don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ were baptized into his death? We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. Notice the strength of the expressions "baptized into Christ," "baptized into His death," and "buried with Him in baptism." Someone may suggest that the primary

reference here is to Spirit baptism. That's true, but at the very least, water baptism is in the background of this passage.

How important is your baptism? It is your personal identification with the greatest act of human history—the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Baptism doesn't save you—salvation comes by faith alone (Ephesians 2:8-9). Your guilt before God is removed the moment you trust in Christ. But baptism is your personal testimony to, and the inward assurance of, your passage from the old life to the new life...

There have been 46 baptisms in the last 3 months at Faith Chapel.


