Pastor's Perspective

We're establishing a new culture. God is moving in our midst in powerful ways week after week and we're seeing a new normal built in the church. I've been getting bombarded with comments from different people all throughout Faith Chapel that are sensing what God is doing and they're all in unison saying, "I'm ready for this! God is doing something, and I don't want to miss anything He has for me." This mentality blesses me so much because I know what it's like to wave at a window of opportunity that passes me by and it's excruciating. I don't want that for anyone!

We see this played out Scripturally and it broke the heart of Christ. Luke tells us in, Luke.19:40-42 As He approached Jerusalem and saw the city, He wept over it and said, "If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace—but now it is hidden from your eyes.

Jesus wept over Jerusalem and rebuked the Jews for not knowing the day of their visitation. Because the Jews were undiscerning, they had eyes but could not see; ears, but did not hear; hearts, but did not understand; they failed to recognize and embrace the Messiah when He visited. Personally speaking, I've been able to recognize when God was doing something new in my life. Those moments were marked with an invitation from the Spirit of God to either step into the new thing God was doing or to miss it. I've done both. To my discredit, I've been selfish and stagnant in those moments, unwilling to change and missed new oil being poured out. I've also capitalized on the moment and seen God take me to new depths in His love for me and those new depths were met with new opportunities and adventures. What will you do? Take it from me, there's something fresh being poured out on Faith Chapel! There's a new wine coming, and we must be willing to embrace a new wineskin to contain what He's got for us.

Prepare your heart. Spend some time thinking about areas you've felt stuck in and ask God for His grace to help pull your feet out of the mud. Welcome the guidance of His Spirit in your life and family in a new way. Look around at the people here in the church and see if you can see the new things God's doing all around us. Lugar de Encuentro 20th Anniversary

Lugar de Encuentro Church celebrates their 20th anniversary on Tuesday October 14th. In the beginning, Pastor Jose Gabriel Beas, his wife Anna and four children were the only official members. Among the attendance that first day were family, friends, visitors, and children who numbered approximately forty people. That same day Pastor Beas introduced the "Vision" and the name, "Lugar de Encuentro" which means place of encounter. The first meetings of LDE were held at a place located on Broadway Avenue in Lemon Grove. They were in this location for about 2 years. The congregation grew and multiplied and in November of 2005, believing God they moved to 9617 Campo Road in Spring Valley. At the end of 2012, seeing the need for a bigger place with more parking, they began praying for direction. Again, God opened doors, and in the first part of September 2023, LDE arrived at Faith Chapel. Pastor Beas remembers God telling him: "Yes, Faith Chapel will be a blessing to you, and you (LDE) will be a blessing to them as well." Pastor Beas recognizes that God has always supported the work at Lugar de Encuentro and proves it repeatedly. Pastor Beas writes "This month of October 2023, marks 10 years of being here with our amazing family of Faith Chapel, and 20 years of having founded

Emergency Drill Recap

An emergency evacuation drill was conducted during our September 10th Sunday Service. Knowing what to do, how to respond and follow the direction of the safety team during an emergency is an important part of preparing for the safety of our attendees. Here are a few observations from the drill.

- Please wait for instructions before leaving the building. If you exit in the wrong direction, you could put yourself and others in danger.
- Go directly to the safe zone as instructed.
- Do not use the restroom or go to your vehicle. Your vehicle could obstruct first responders arriving on scene.
- Do not attempt to find your children. They are evacuated to a safe zone and once the "all clear" announcement is given you may retrieve them then.

Overall, everyone did a great job and were very cooperative. A big thank you to everyone who participated in our Emergency Evacuation Drill.
