I'm honored and privileged to be in the role I find myself in today. My wife Ashley and I have spent much of this last year in seasons of fasting and prayer to hear what the Lord was saying to us so that we can obey what we hear Him saying. This is how we live our life — hearing and obeying. Sometimes,

what we're hearing makes sense and requires little faith to be obedient. Other times what we're hearing doesn't make a whole lot of sense at all and takes bold faith to walk in obedience. Regardless, I don't get the luxury of choosing the path with the least number of hazards or challenges. My duty is obedience.

It takes faith to be obedient. It takes faith to trust that what we're hearing from the Lord is indeed the Lord. This comes from relationship building with the Lord over time. He promises us in **John.10:27** – "My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me." The more we hear, the more familiar we become with His voice. The more familiar we become with His voice, the easier it is to obey. The more we obey, the more we see that we heard correctly, and our faith increases even more. This is relationship! This is sons and daughters learning to hear the voice of the One they're passionately in love with. It's sheep learning to trust the Shepherd because we know that He is good and has only our best interest in mind.

We are on quite a journey. We're confident that we are where God wants us to be, and that he wants us as Lead Pastors of Faith Chapel. Where are you? What are you currently praying for or about? Do you believe that He'll speak to you when you ask Him something or spend time in prayer believing in His direction? As stated in our "Dream with Me" series, and the "Beloved" series, "You won't ever obey if you're not hearing. You won't ever hear if you have no intention of obeying. They dance together." Is your heart ready to obey whatever you hear from Him? Is your faith ready to step into this new adventure with the Lord as He ultimately guides you? If it's not, pray a simple prayer of invitation to the Holy Spirit to direct you in new ways. Make it clear, you're targeting faith into hearing and obeying whatever He calls you to do. Then, get ready...you'll embark on a wild journey that He'll be leading you into and who knows what blessings await you! Here we go.

Invitation to Prayer Night

September's prayer night will be held on Sunday the 3rd. At 5:30pm we will continue to watch the Jim Cymbala video regarding prayer followed by prayer time at 6:00pm. Group prayer among Christians is important and rewarding. Group prayer was important in the early church as something that bound them together as they carried out the Great Commission. In Acts 4:31, group prayer is noted, "And when they had prayed, the place where they had gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak the word of God with boldness." God gave boldness to the whole group in their witness, in response to their prayer. Group prayer knits believers together and encourages the burdened. When a group of believers pray together, the result is unity, humility, thanksgiving, confession of sin, intercession, and discovery of God's will. In the book, Restored Power: Becoming a Praying Church One Tweak at a Time, by Jonathan Graf, he presents 3 benefits of a praying church. 1. Praying together invites the presence and power of the Holy Spirit. There is a different atmosphere in

churches where people pray together and who have praying people. Worship seems more powerful. There is a sense of connection with God that is not there in non-praying churches. When the Spirit of God is manifestly present, things happen. As you pray together as a congregation, God will begin to "show up" more and more.

- 2. Praying together increases the faith of a congregation to believe God for the miraculous. There is a clear connection between prayer and faith (beyond the fact that we are supposed to pray in faith). Churches that pray together begin to see the miraculous power of God at work in their midst. It goes beyond what they can and should do into what God wants to do through them. If we increase the level of praying together among our congregation, we will see more miracles happen as our faith rises.
- 3. Praying together moves people from seeking their own purposes to desiring God's purposes. "What does God want to do here?" When people pray together. They start to let go of their desires to see their purposes fulfilled and start to open themselves up to what God wants. If people pray together, praying together opens them up to God's desire. Pray together and watch unity grow. Jeremiah 29:11-13 is a powerful promise written to a corporate body of people. "For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart." If we want to see God's blessing in our church, if we want to see Jesus' transforming power, the dynamic ministry of the Holy Spirit in our midst, then we need to pray together. Therefore, please accept this article as a personal invitation to attend Sunday night prayer and watch the Lord work in Faith Chapel.

Grandma Say's Are You on a Diet?... A Spiritual Diet!!

"Man does not live by bread alone but by every word that proceeds out of the mouth of God. (John 4:4) God's word is nourishing and the life of the spirit within us is to be nurtured. The word of God goes deep... God's word is living and effective and sharper than any two-edged sword. It penetrates and divides soul and spirit, joints, and marrow; it judges the reflections and thoughts of the heart. (Hebrews 4:12) Are we still drinking milk and not eating solid food? (1Corinthians 3:2) If we partake only of milk, we are not accustomed to the word of righteousness, for we are a babe. (Hebrews 5:13) Solid food is for the mature. We are to feed our inner man. Out of the abundance of the heart, the mouth speaks. Feed on God's Word. Inject it in your spirit. In Joshua 1:8 God tells us "This book of the law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate it on it day and night." That is not a spiritual diet... Jesus is the word.
