Pastor's Perspective

A beautiful, yet sometimes overlooked; powerful characteristic is hospitality. I've known people who were extremely hospitable and those who simply weren't. I've seen the impact and influence that hospitable people had on those around them, and I've seen the lack thereof from those whose doors were always closed. Like many gifts and qualities — hospitality can be developed. I'm proof of that as I've not always been very hospitable. I've learned to be a more hospitable person and to put my best foot forward when being with people, especially in my home. Taking extra time to ensure the home is clean, food or munchies are prepared, something is offered to drink, and undivided attention says so much. Trying to help others feel comfortable and welcome is often the first open door to them feeling comfortable and

welcomed into spiritual matters. Ultimately, my goal is to benefit their relationship with Jesus to some degree. But this doesn't always happen on

the first time someone steps into my home. The more comfortable and welcomed they feel the more their natural guards come crashing down and a pathway is paved for more spiritual matters surface. When Paul is writing to his "true son in the faith" Titus, he begins giving him instruction on what qualities should be looked for in an Elder. In verse 8 he says: Titus 1:8 (NIV) Rather, he must be hospitable, one who loves what is good, who is self-controlled, upright, holy and disciplined. There's a large list of what an Elder should be encouraged to do but hospitality is certainly one of them. Though you may not be aspiring to be an Elder,

these healthy characteristics are certainly beneficial as you grow in being an influential person. Paul knew something that was desperately needed as the church grew — hospitable leaders. Ones who were willing to bring others into their homes in order to build community and of course engage with the Gospel in their lives. We should always be living on mission. When you're gaining influence in somebody's life it should be second nature for you to want to pray with them, love on them, hear their story, tell them yours and naturally JESUS will be discussed there! You don't even have to intentionally be "evangelizing" somebody. Just being friendly and taking an interest in them as they likely are taking an interest in you will pay huge dividends. If Jesus has done something beautiful in your life, tell them about it!

My main point I'd like for you take away from this is, when you live a hospitable lifestyle, you'll discover many more natural conversations that lead to glorifying God and bringing Jesus to those Jesus brings into your life. Don't miss opportunities He brings you — of course. But you can also create new opportunities simply by being hospitable.



Faith Chapel's next prayer night is October 13th at 6:00pm. Join us as we come before the Lord in corporate prayer for our church, for people, and for the world around us.




Homeless Cookies

Flash Back

Weekly Television Program to Premiere on Cable 4 TV on October 12th

"On Thursday evening October 12th at 10:00 pm, Faith Chapel will premiere its weekly television program, "Faith Chapel with George Gregg." Aired on Mission Cable 4, the 30-minute program will be seen each week at this scheduled time. Roy Anthony, executive producer of the program explained that the music bank taping was completed September 25th and 26th and would be edited into each program making up about 1/3 of the program. Anthony explained that the programs would be simply good gospel music and Bible teaching by pastor Gregg. Songs by the choir, quartets and soloists are complete for the year and will be selected from the music bank. Pastor Greg has taped several sermons at a time in a special setting in the Upper Room and not during the services. His first sermon is entitled "Forgiveness." The set, built by Verne Larson, will be moved when necessary to Western Video Studio for future tapings. Assisting Roy Anthony with production is Mark Thomas; director, Vern Larson, associate producer; channel 10's Gil Jimenez, art director; and Wayne Herbert, audio. Glen Aubrey will act as special spokesman/host. Faith Chapel is reaching out to others through this vital ministry and will be reaching thousands of people.
